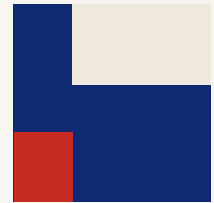

Complex treatment decisions require more than access to a physician or clinic.

They require a deliberately structured process: first, a thorough understanding of the procedure; then, an individual medical assessment of the person considering treatment.



Procedural knowledge and the medical assessment of an individual case are distinct professional functions.

UHNW Aesthetics has developed a clearly defined pathway that places these two functions in the appropriate sequence.

One pathway. Two clearly defined phases.

ASSESS THE INDIVIDUAL CASE

*Independent Individual
Medical Case Review*

- patient-specific
- provided directly by a physician
- under the physician's own clinical responsibility
- within a separate physician-patient relationship

A structured pathway. Two clearly defined phases. One objective: better-informed, safety-conscious treatment decisions.

Phase 1 is provided by UHNW Aesthetics. Phase 2 is provided under a separate, direct physician engagement by an appropriately qualified and duly licensed physician freely selected by the Participant.

UNDERSTAND THE PROCEDURE

UHNW Aesthetics provides vetted Family Offices, Private Offices, qualified agencies and Participants admitted following rigorous access review with in-depth, procedure-specific information. Vetted professors develop the content; the President approves it. The module author responsible for the subject matter presents it personally.

01 PROCEDURE

How a procedure is generally planned and performed, including potential variants and technical distinctions.

02 RISK

Material risks, potential mechanisms of complication and significant warning signs.

03 QUALITY

Requirements relating to the physician performing the procedure, the facility, anaesthesia and aftercare.

04 DECISION FRAMEWORK

Examinations, preparatory steps, due diligence and the questions that must then be addressed individually by a physician.

Phase 1 provides professor-led, procedure-specific information. Individual medical assessment begins only in Phase 2.

What must be reviewed?

Which conditions should be met?

Which questions must not remain unresolved before treatment?

01 SELECTION

The professor is selected by reference to the chosen subject or treatment area and their expert authorship of the relevant information module.

02 SUBJECT-MATTER ASSIGNMENT

Assignment is based on subject area, authorship and the defined quality requirements.

03 DATA SEPARATION BY DESIGN

Phase 1 processes contact, access and subject-area information. Medical data relating to individual cases remains outside UHNW Aesthetics systems.

OUTCOME OF PHASE 1

By the conclusion of Phase 1, the Participant has a structured understanding of the procedure, its variants, risks and quality requirements, together with the medical questions that should be reviewed individually before a personal treatment decision is made.

Is this treatment medically appropriate for your specific case?

Robust procedural knowledge alone cannot answer this decisive question. The UHNW framework therefore expressly provides for a patient-specific assessment by an appropriately qualified and duly licensed physician.



CONTINUITY OF EXPERTISE

The same vetted professor may undertake Phase 2. Equally, the Participant may select another appropriately qualified and duly licensed physician. The defined quality criteria apply; Phase 2 begins under a new, direct physician engagement.

01 PHASE 1

Author and subject-matter presenter within UHNW Aesthetics.

02 PHASE 2

A directly and independently engaged physician acting under their own clinical responsibility.

What Phase 2 may include

The engaged physician independently determines which records, examinations or in-person consultations are required and whether the service may lawfully be provided in person or remotely.

OUTCOME OF PHASE 2

In Phase 2, the directly engaged physician makes an individual medical assessment based on the information actually available and under their own clinical responsibility.

The same expertise can continue - under a separate physician engagement.



The same vetted professor may participate in both phases. For Phase 2, the Participant may equally select another appropriately qualified and duly licensed physician. The individual assessment always begins under a separate, direct physician engagement.

01 FREE CHOICE

The Participant freely decides which physician to engage.

02 INDEPENDENT DECISION TO ACCEPT

The professor independently decides whether to accept the physician engagement.

03 REGULATORY PERMISSIBILITY

The services must comply with applicable professional and telemedicine rules.

04 SEPARATE AGREEMENT

Phase 2 is governed by a separate physician agreement.

05 MEDICAL DATA PROVIDED DIRECTLY

All case-specific medical information is sent directly to the physician and does not enter UHNW Aesthetics systems.

06 INDEPENDENT CLINICAL JUDGEMENT

The assessment reflects the physician's independent clinical judgement.

Phase 2 begins when a new, direct physician engagement is accepted.

THE SAME EXPERTISE. A SEPARATE ENGAGEMENT. CLEAR CLINICAL RESPONSIBILITY.

Continuity of expertise. Separation of interests.

THE REVIEW PRINCIPLE

The reviewing professor may provide the Participant with independent advice and support. The professor does not personally perform the elective procedure under review and has no direct or indirect financial interest in its performance. This does not preclude urgent emergency intervention required to avert an acute danger.

Within the separate physician engagement, the professor may provide a second opinion or a Case-Specific Medical Assessment Report and support the Participant throughout the subsequent treatment pathway.

01 INSTITUTIONAL SEPARATION

UHNW Aesthetics maintains structural separation from clinics and medical institutions.

02 FEE INDEPENDENCE

Institutional funding remains separate from physicians' fees and from the performance of any procedure.

03 OPEN CHOICE OF PROVIDER

The Participant freely selects the physician performing the procedure and the treatment provider.

04 INDEPENDENT JUDGEMENT

The individual medical assessment reflects the physician's independent professional judgement.

05 FREE CHOICE

The choice of physician, clinic and treatment remains with the Participant.

The UHNW Aesthetics Safety Philosophy

Safety is not treated as a single recommendation, but as a structured decision-making process.



UHNW Aesthetics establishes the expert and structural foundation. Individual clinical responsibility remains within the direct physician-patient relationship.

Access

Access is intended primarily for vetted Family Offices, Private Offices, qualified agencies and institutional representatives. Direct Principal access is subject to rigorous review by the designated Access Committee.

THE ACCESS REVIEW COVERS

- identity and access eligibility
- institutional suitability or, for direct Principal access, approval by the Access Committee
- the requested general subject or treatment area
- provision of the relevant treatment information module

The access review assesses identity, eligibility and institutional suitability. In Phase 1, only contact, access and subject-area information is processed.

Selected Participants receive access to Phase 1 without a Participant fee.

Funding

Voluntary institutional support from the Salazar Foundation relates exclusively to UHNW Aesthetics' general organisational and information-related expenditure.

INSTITUTIONAL FUNDING FRAMEWORK

Institutional support funds UHNW Aesthetics' organisational and information-related expenditure.

PHASE 2

Any fees for Phase 2 are agreed exclusively between the Participant and the directly engaged physician.

A clearer standard for treatment decisions.

UHNW Aesthetics applies a Family Office standard of diligence to the selection of specialist professors and the validation of procedure-specific content. Professor-led Treatment Intelligence provides a structured foundation for informed decisions.

03 CLARITY ON WHAT REQUIRES INDIVIDUAL REVIEW

Within UHNW Aesthetics, the vetted module author presents the content approved by the President.

In Phase 2, the physician freely selected and directly engaged by the Participant assesses the individual case.

The Participant may select the same professor or another appropriately qualified physician. The framework combines continuity of expertise and freedom of physician choice with a clear separation of engagements, data, responsibilities and financial interests.

Allocation of Responsibilities and Legal Framework

The Two-Phase Safety Framework places professor-led, procedure-specific information and individual medical assessment within a clearly defined decision pathway. Phase 1 is provided by UHNW Aesthetics; Phase 2 arises from the Participant's direct physician engagement.

PHASE 1

Phase 1 is UHNW Aesthetics' professor-led information service. Vetted professors develop the content; the President approves it. The content structures procedure-level information, quality requirements and the questions requiring individual assessment by a physician.

PHASE 2

Phase 2 begins under a separate, direct agreement between the Participant and a physician of their choosing. The patient-specific assessment is undertaken under that physician's own professional, regulatory and medical responsibility.

ROLE

If the same professor provides Phase 2, that individual acts under the newly accepted physician engagement and their own professional responsibility.

INDEPENDENCE

Independence combines freedom of physician choice with independent clinical judgement. The reviewing physician does not perform the elective procedure under review and remains financially separate from its outcome. This does not preclude urgent emergency intervention required to avert an acute danger.

DIRECT RELATIONSHIP

The agreement, patient information and consent process, health data, documentation, fees, professional indemnity and medical responsibility for Phase 2 exist exclusively between the physician and the Participant.

FINANCIAL SEPARATION

UHNW Aesthetics' institutional funding remains separate from physician fees and subsequent engagements.

CASE-SPECIFIC MEDICAL ASSESSMENT REPORT

The Case-Specific Medical Assessment Report is prepared by the directly engaged physician for the individual case. Responsibility, limitations and use are governed by the engagement and applicable law.

CONCEPTUALLY CONNECTED. CONTRACTUALLY, CLINICALLY AND REGULATORILY SEPARATE.

LEGAL IDENTITY
